**Reception** have been thinking about kindness during 'Anti-Bullying Week'. They each printed a hand to add to a big class heart to remind them to always be kind to others.









As part of anti-bullying week, the children have been thinking about how to 'speak out' about any bullying they see or hear, including cyber bullying. We know that the online world is ever changing and we want to support our school community to understand the world our children are living in. As part of our anti-bullying week, Key Stage 2 had Richard Pomfrett, founder of the 'Stay Safe Initiative' in to carry out a morning workshop on antibullying and friendship. He covered many key points including: what bullying is; the types of bullying; how to deal with the different types of bullying and the golden rule – 'Speak up and tell someone'. The children learnt a great deal and thoroughly enjoyed the interactive and engaging activities. Year 3 followed up the workshop by producing posters of what they have learnt. ### YEARS 3 & 4 BASKETBALL

On Monday a group of year 3 & 4 children took part in a Basketball festival at Poltair School along with other primary school children in the local area. They were taught how to shoot some hoops, dribble and passing skills. Afterwards they were mixed into groups with the other schools to compete in a mini competition. Well



done to Kyla, Mia, Caleb and Tommy, who were awarded a certificate as were on the winning teams, but a huge well done to everyone for representing Pondhu so impeccably.

### <u>YEAR 3</u>

Year 3 have been continuing their topic of the Stone Age to the Iron Age by producing their very own cave paintings. They created a rough textured surface to replicate the stone by using grains of wheat and seeds. They also made their own paint using flour and water and used spices to add colour.





Finally they drew and painted their very own line drawings that they had practiced earlier on in the topic.







### Y4 Trip to Wheal Martin

On Wednesday, Thunberg Class went to Wheal Martyn to learn about how the clay pits operated in the past. We had a guided tour where we learnt the processes involved in working at the china clay pit. During our guided tour we were even lucky enough to see a explosion to extract the china clay and we had the best view as were looking down on the clay pits. Children learnt what it would have been like to work in the clay pits in the Victorian era and how they used water to generate energy. This linked to our class topic from last term, water, rivers and generating hydro-power. We were very lucky to visit the outside areas during the sunny part of the day and we got to view the beautiful nature reserve as we were walking through the site.

In the afternoon, we took part in a sound workshop which consolidated all the learning we have been doing in science. Children took part in different activities to investigate how sound is produced, pitch and volume. The activities included playing boomwackers, making an orchestra with glasses and even making a telephone, which they particularly enjoyed! The children were able to explain the learning we had carried out in class using great scientific descriptions and vocabulary.
