Science

Intent: to develop knowledge of evolution and inheritance.

SEQUENCE OF LESSONS

- 1. Recognise that living things produce offspring that is of the same kind but variation occurs.
- 2. Understand how animals are adapted to suit their environment in different ways.
- 3. Examine theories and arguments, and understand how adaption can lead to evolution.
- 4. Use fossils to understand how living things chance over time.
- 5. Recognise that fossils provide evidence for changes over millions of years.
- 6. Identify how adaptations can benefit creatures and increase chances of survival.

Key Vocabulary: evolution, adaptation, inheritance, variation, survival, theory, evidence.

Impact: Children can explain how different rocks are formed and describe features of these rocks.

History - Ancient Greece

Intent: To understand in what ways ancient Greece changed.

SEOUENCE OF LESSONS

Impact: Children can recall key facts about the Ancient Greek society and understand the changes throughout.

Intent: To recognize how volcanoes affect the people and land around them

SEQUENCE OF LESSONS

Impact: Children can recall what happens when a volcano erupts, how it affects the land and how this affects people.

RE - Judaism 2: Joseph, Moses and the Exodus

Intent: To understand the story of the Exodus and its importance to Jews

SEQUENCE OF LESSONS

- 1. Joseph and his coat of many colours.
- 2. Slaves in Egypt
- 3. "Let my people go!"
- 4. The last night in Egypt.
- 5. The sea, the mountain, the law and the tent.
- 6. Why are these stories so important to Jews?

Impact: To explain why the story of the Exodus is so important to Jews and the lessons it teaches them for life.

SEQUENCE OF LESSONS

Intent: To invent an electronic product.

SEQUENCE OF LESSONS

Key Vocabulary: adapt, algorithm, coding, debug, image rights, repetition, sequence, software, structure, variable, video, website

Impact: children can invent and advertise an electronic product using different software.

Art - Drawing

Intent: to use mark making and drawing techniques to share my voice.

Key Vocabulary: aesthetic, audience, character traits, commissioned, composition, expressive, graffiti, guerilla, imagery, impact, interpretation, representation.

Impact: children will be able to use a range of mark making techniques.

PE -Netball/Leadership

Intent: to progress to competitive netball games.

To develop leadership skills.
